ABOUT US

Lipscombe Park Kindergarten is a not-for-profit incorporated association operating a community-based three & fouryear-old sessional kindergarten program.

Lipscombe Park Kindergarten is operated by highly qualified, dedicated & experienced staff and is managed by a Committee of Management comprised of volunteer kindergarten parents.

We are proud to have recently achieved the rating of "Exceeding National Standards" in all seven areas of the National Quality Framework, a great recognition of the quality of our educators and kindergarten program.

ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

What sort of program do you offer?

We offer play -based learning and incorporate the Victorian Early Learning Years Development Framework in our planning. Lipscombe Park Kindergarten "Exceeds Expectations" in all areas of the National Quality Standard Assessment & Rating conducted by the Department of Education and Training.

How big are the class sizes?

3YO groups have a class size of 20 children, while our 4YO groups have a maximum of 28 children

How much does kindergarten cost?

Fees are set by the Committee of Management in the year prior to enrolment. Fees for 3YO kindergarten for 2022 are set at \$165 per term for 5 hours per week, inclusive of all incursions. Fees for 4YO kindergarten for 2022 are set at \$490 per term for 15 hours per week, inclusive of all incursions and excursions.

Do families on a Pensioner/Health care card get a discount?

Families enrolled in the 4-year-old program with a concession card pay no fees. The subsidy is not applicable for the 3-year-old program.

Which primary schools do Lipscombe Park Kindergarten children go to?

Croydon Hills Primary School and Good Shepherd Lutheran Primary School are the main feeder schools with some children also attending Yarra Road, Kalinda, Holy Spirit, Sacred Hart and Ainslie Parklands Primary School

ENROLMENT PROCESS & TIMELINES

How do I enrol my child?

The Maroondah Integrated Kindergarten Association (MIKA) maintains a central enrolment system and allocates places according to parents' preferences and locality to their chosen kindergarten. 20 community-based and one private kindergarten use the MIKA Central Enrolment System. Applications should be made to MIKA at www.mika.org.au between 1 March and 30 June the year before the child is eligible to attend Kindergarten. When will my enrolment and session times be confirmed?

The below outlines the enrolment process and timelines (approximate)

- March June Submit enrolment form to MIKA with fee
- August Offers of places emailed to parents by MIKA
- August Acceptances returned to Lipscombe Park Kindergarten with your deposit
- September Group preferences & other information posted to parents

How do I know if my child is ready for Kindergarten?

Yes, please speak with the staff directly about any concerns you may have. Lipscombe Park Kindergarten is an inclusive kindergarten and we aim to make your child feel completely incorporated into the program.

Do you offer a Transition program?

A transition program is offered during the first few weeks of term 1. This enables both staff and children to become accustomed to each other, and the children to their new surroundings. The session times and days are reduced to help the children cope with a busy new environment.

Does the Kindergarten have a uniform?

Yes - the uniform is not compulsory but does save wear and tear on your child's clothes. We encourage parents to purchase new or second-hand uniforms for your child to wear while attending kindergarten. The uniform consists of windcheaters, hoodies, t-shirts and hats.

How can parents be involved at kindergarten?

Parent's involvement is encouraged and valued at Lipscombe Park Kindergarten. Parents can help with kindergarten duty, library borrowing, reading stories, helping with activities, or joining the Committee of Management. You will need to provide a Working with Children Check.

Lipscombe Park complies with the No Jab, No Play policy. What does this mean for our family?

Lipscombe Park Kindergarten requires a copy of the child's immunisation statement before commencing.

The Victorian Government has amended the Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008.

All parents/guardians planning to enrol their child at childcare or kindergarten in Victoria must provide the service with evidence that their child is:

- fully immunised for their age OR
- on a vaccination catch-up program OR
- unable to be fully immunised for medical reasons.
